

Content	In the light of this pandemic, a summer project was established aimed to develop student's skills in scientific research and usage of available resources. It started with gathering who are interested in the research field followed by introductory sessions delivered by the mentor who used Learning Management System (LMS) meeting and also uploaded materials about research methodology and asked the students to study them. The research topics were primarily prepared by the mentor included medical education topics, team building, leadership skills, etc. Other topics were based on the autopsy archives of the Pathology Department, including animal autopsy in medical education, obstetric catastrophes, etc. After that, the students were divided into small groups regarding their preferred topic. The teams have set a goal to build and establish a fixed basis in learning research curriculum in a practical manner and to publish their work. Each research team arranged primary online discussions to choose the appropriate methodology according to their topic whether to use qualitative, quantitative, or mixed methods consisting of questionnaires, focus groups, interviews, DELPHI technique, etc. The research plan was designed and applied by the students themselves. Then, secondary online discussions were established so each student who was assigned to a specific task was also responsible for explaining it to his colleagues including research writing skills, how to design interviews, etc. Finally, the pandemic was not a burden but a motivation to break our limits and help each other to be better which created a great experience that we want to share.
