

Content	This presentation will review and discuss the outcomes of piloting the Social Accountability as the Framework for Engagement for Health Institutions (SAFE for HI) Evaluation Tool and peer review process in an Academic Health Sciences Centre's Emergency Department. As the third step in a series of successive studies under the SAFE for HI Project, the piloting of the SAFE for HI Evaluation Tool and peer review process was a critical step to assess their real-world ability to evaluate the social accountability of health institutions who focus on health care service delivery. The piloting of the SAFE for HI Evaluation Tool and peer review process began in March 2021. The primary outcome of the pilot study is to gauge the ability of the SAFE for HI Evaluation Tool and peer review process to identify core, critical elements of social accountability as defined by the SAFE for HI Project and generate a SAFE for HI Evaluation Report. The SAFE for HI Evaluation Report will be provided to the Academic Health Sciences Centre's Emergency Department to highlight its strengths and areas to consider for improvements on its social accountability journey.

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
