

Content	Background: MedSIN GMSA is an NGO, part of the international federation of medical students association, representing Gezira medical students. The standing committee on medical education is one of its committees that works in medical education capacity building and provide platforms and methods for students on medical education. Objectives: Assess the level, role, and impact of SCOME in raising medical students' awareness regarding medical education. Methodology: Longitudinal descriptive study has been done in a period of one year to assess the role of MedSIN GMSA SCOME in raising medical students' awareness regarding medical education. A Complete year reports have been analyzed, Pre and post evaluation forms have been used, students have been interviewed, questioning, and directly observed. Outcomes: The results showed that we succeeded in getting the student's attention to medical education. We covered most of the important skills that students need regarding medical practice, with a focus on describing and solving the problems that medical students face. We provided them with leadership and teambuilding skills, suitable knowledge regarding the accreditation concept and steps, the role of medical students in the accreditation. Conclusion and recommendations: By the end of the term, we successfully capacitated more than 93 members in medical education, making them able to advocate for the medical education issues and practice it well with other medical students in the faculty and the medical community in general. More education for the medical students' regarding such topics should be done. Awareness should be raised on the general attitudes, which should be adopted to contribute to improving their skills in education.

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
